A thorough and creative approach to identifying & using research material is demonstrated. At least 20 relevant sources of research material have been identified, explained and organized effectively (10)	The obvious reference materials have been identified and are used appropriately. Approximately 15 relevant sources of research material have been identified, explained and organized effectively (8)	Some of the reference materials one would expect to see have not been included, but some have. Approximately 10 relevant sources of research material have been identified, explained and organized effectively (5)	The reference materials used are not appropriate and/or do not address the research question. Approximately 8 relevant sources have been identified and used effectively, or most of the research material is not relevant or organized (3)	There are few or no indications that the student conducted any research. Argumentation (10 points)

Collection of Evidence and Analysis (10 points)

Organization (10 points)

Technical Competence (6 points)

Reference and Citation Use and Format (8 points)

Application of Core Concepts (6 points)

Student demonstrates sophisticated understanding of core concepts in this subfield and applies them appropriately to the research (6)	Student demonstrates basic understanding of core concepts in this subfield and applies them appropriately to the research (5)	Student does not clearly relate basic concepts from the subfield to the research topic, though the research is consistent with them (3)	Student misrepresents or misunderstands the core concepts of the subfield (1)	It is in no way apparent that the student had ever understood the core concepts in the subfield (0)

Fair and Balanced (6 points)

Student reports on opposing views and responds to them fairly and accurately (6)	Student reports on opposing views but tends to treat them as not serious threats to their argument (5)	Student recognizes opposing viewpoints but doesn't address them directly (3)	Student misrepresents opposing viewpoints (1)	That there might be an opposing point of view is not acknowledged. (0)

Presentation (6 points)

Creative formatting, good use of illustrations, charts, graphs, table of contents, reference list, etc. (6)	Good use of illustrations, charts, graphs, table of contents, reference list, etc..
